#### **About the Board**

Board members have the privilege of having input into the governance of the organisation and its support of Queensland's Neighbourhood Centre sector. There is a time commitment involved in becoming a NCQ Board Member, with monthly online meetings and weekly governance tasks and strategic work to ensure the strong future of our organisation and sector. **Note:** 'Metropolitan Zone' means SEQ, specifically metropolitan Brisbane, the Sunshine Coast and the Gold Coast.

'Rural/Regional Zone' means the remaining areas in Queensland that are not part of the Metropolitan Zone.

This year NCQ has one (1) vacancy in Metropolitan Zones and two (2) vacancies in Rural/Regional Zones.

#### To complete the form, you will need a:

• Nominator: The Nominator must be from a Neighbourhood Centres Queensland member organisation in the same region as the nominee (Metropolitan or Regional/Remote). They can be from the same organisation as the nominee.

• Seconder: The Seconder must be from a different Neighbourhood Centre Queensland member organisation to the Nominator.
